

# **Murmurings from the Manse**

It is Friday, the 21<sup>st</sup> of November and as I write there is a beautiful rose blooming in my garden. I had to look twice before it registered, because it is so unexpected but at the same time, it is such a gift and despite the cold and the rain it has opened and it is providing a perfect touch of colour.

What a blessing, what a gift.

By the time you receive the newsletter we will nearly be in December and looking forward to Christmas, we will also be engaged in what could be described as the struggle to keep Christ in Christmas, something that can be quite challenging as we try to tell the Christmas Story.

I was told the Christmas story a few weeks ago by Evie Mae Lewis. Evie is 2 ½, she is the daughter of a cousin of mine and thanks to her Church going Gran (who was determined that she should know the true meaning of the story as soon as she could take it in), was able to tell me that Jesus was born in a stable, she told me about the angels who had wings, and the shepherds and the star and kings who visited the baby. She told the story with the simplicity of a child and it was something special to hear, it made my Christmas and even writing this I have a smile on my face.

Like the rose in my garden the birth of our Lord and Saviour was a gift from God, but a gift like no other, a gift for the world, even though the world had not asked for it and often does not deserve it and the birth was also a blessing, a blessing to a people who had hoped and prayed and asked God to do something to help change their lives.

Amidst the turkey and tinsel, the family get togethers and the squabbles, is the reality of Christmas, not the carefully staged Nativity tableau, but a story of homelessness and rejection, of public scandal and not a little pain. And over and above it all is this amazing plan that God had to save the world by the gift to the world of His only Son. It is the most tremendous story of all, and it is ours not just to tell, but to live. So let us celebrate God's amazing gift as we look forward once again to the birth of our Lord and Saviour, born as a baby in a manger, let us sing our carols and give thanks, let us celebrate and enjoy this time; and in our celebrations let us remember and pray for those for whom this is a difficult time.
