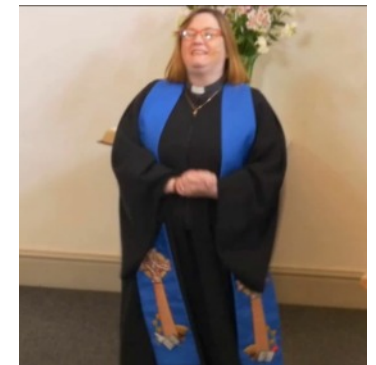

The URC has a new logo in use from 1st June 2016. For the past six months, the URC's design team has been working to make the denomination's visual identity more positive, striking and adaptable.
