# Murmurings from the Manse

Reconciliation was the theme of this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, it had plenty within it to encourage thought and debate, so much so that I am still thinking about it! Reconciliation is one of those words which has many levels of understanding, the idea of reconciliation is even broader, but my thoughts, in the light of the event which took place in the middle of the week in America, turn to internal reconciliation within countries.
